



NAPA/SOLANO AREA AGENCY ON AGING DESCRIPTION:

Napa/Solano Area Agency on Aging (N/S AAA) contracts with Molly's Angels to provide the Long-Term Care Ombudsman Program services to people living in Napa County. The mission of the N/S AAA is to create and support opportunities that enhance the lives of older adults and their families to be safe, healthy, and independent.

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION:

The Long-Term Care Ombudsman Program (LTCOP) provides advocacy and assistance to older adults and dependent adults residing in long-term care facilities within Napa County. Services are provided by paid staff and volunteers certified by the Office of the State Long-Term Care Ombudsman (OSLTCO). The primary activity of the LTCOP is to support county residents living in licensed long-term care settings by attempting to resolve concerns and complaints about their care and quality of life.

POSITION SUMMARY:

Under administrative direction from Molly's Angels the Ombudsman Program Coordinator has primary responsibility for the overall management and day-to-day operations of the Long-Term Care Ombudsman Program, including supervision of all paid staff and volunteers. The Coordinator must ensure compliance with laws, regulations and policies and procedures required by the federal Older Americans Act, the Older Californians Act, the OSLTCO, and N/S AAA.

DUTIES:

- Supervise the activities of all Ombudsman representatives (staff and volunteers).
- Create and maintain a plan for recruitment, screening, training, supervision, and retention of volunteers; provide at least annual recruiting, training, and certification opportunity for potential volunteers.
- Create and maintain a plan for individual and group recognition of service and accomplishments throughout the year; provide an annual volunteer recognition activity with input from volunteers.

- Determine budget priorities, participate in budget preparation and be regularly informed during each funding cycle about the status of program allocations and expenditure or the need for budget adjustments.
- Coordinate and share information with the OSLTCO and N/S AAA.
- Notify the OSLTCO assigned program analyst about: staffing changes, complex cases, situations with potential legal implications, emerging issues and patterns with statewide impact.
- Consult with the OSLTCO assigned program analyst about: confidentiality provisions, conflict
 of interest, laws and regulations governing the program and LTC facilities, issues with
 Ombudsman representatives, and any other program issues.
- Ensure that program staff and volunteers comply with all confidentiality laws.
- Training and Certification: Conduct regular meetings with staff and volunteers to provide opportunities for case review, education and training, and to transmit information from the OSLTCO.
- Assure and document certification requirements for all paid and volunteer Ombudsman representatives, including 36 hours of certification training, mentored field service with an experienced Ombudsman, and annual continuing education hours.
- Ensure completion of criminal background clearance for all Ombudsman applicants prior to certification; follow the OSLTCO policy on certification and decertification as specified in the California Department of Aging's Program Memo PM 12-05(P).
- Facility Coverage:
 - Establish and maintain a regular and ongoing presence of Ombudsman representative in skilled nursing facilities, intermediate care facilities, and residential care facilities for the elderly.
 - Develop and maintain a current facility coverage plan outlining Ombudsman presence;
 the plan shall match the local area and needs.
 - o Maintain facility files which include appropriate materials for use by the program and has a basis for informing the public about the facility.
- Complaint Management:
 - Ensure the appropriate receipt, investigation, documentation and resolution of complaints made by, and on behalf of, LTC facility residents.
 - Develop and maintain a policy for complaint management that incorporates the current policies of the OSLTCO.
 - o Coordinate with other agencies as necessary in responding to complaints, such as the local offices of the Department of Social Services, Community Care Licensing Division; the Department of Public Health, Licensing and Certification Program; Department of Justice, Bureau of Medi-Cal Fraud and Elder Abuse; and/or local law enforcement.
- Ensure that LTC facility residents have regular and timely access to Ombudsman services and receive timely responses to their complaints; designate at least one alternate certified Ombudsman representative to be available at all times to take after-hours referrals from the state's 24-hour CRISISline operators.
- Comply with data reporting requirements as described in the National Ombudsman Reporting System (NORS) and the OSLTCO; Ombudsman Data Integration Network (ODIN) reporting system.

- Develop adequate resources to assist LTC residents, their families and friends, care providers, and members of the community with information about available community resources, residents' rights, and other LTC issues.
- Train and register Ombudsman representatives in the witnessing of Advance Health Care
 Directives and property transfers; witnessing services will be provided as requested for
 resident of skilled nursing facilities and other long-term health-care facilities, respectively.
- Additional responsibilities as resources and program priorities permit:
 - Assist residents and their families in the development of family councils and participate in resident council meetings, as requested by residents.
 - Attend Citation Review Conferences to advocate for residents when requested.
 - Provide public information to interested persons about local LTC facilities and how to select an appropriate facility.
- Elder Abuse Prevention: Activities include elder abuse prevention training sessions, distribution of educational materials, and system development activities; mandated reporting responsibilities.
- Coordinated System Development: participate in local system development activities such as participation in the local Multi-Disciplinary Team (MDT), the Fiduciary Abuse Specialist Team (FAST), and the Elder Death Review Team (EDRT).

QUALIFICATIONS:

- Experience in management or leadership of community programs/organizations
- Experience with investigative or conflict resolution services.
- Knowledge of gerontology and aging programs, including the Older Americans Act, and Older Californians Act.
- Knowledge and experience in the field of Long-term care, including laws and regulations governing LTC facilities.
- Experience in recruiting, screening, training, and retaining volunteers.
- Interest and commitment to services to older adults; general understanding of the normal aging process and of the common needs/concerns of older adults age 60-100 and their partners or family caregivers.
- Participation in design and implementation of program policies and procedures.
- Experience working with a diverse population including people with various disabilities, older adults and their families.
- Experience in gathering, categorizing, processing, and analyzing data efficiently and accurately.

REQUIREMENTS:

In order to provide essential leadership and motivation to LTC Ombudsman staff and volunteers, the Coordinator must:

- Apply for and receive a criminal background clearance from the California Department of Justice (CA DOJ) and the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI).
- Be free of conflicts of interest.
- Complete the requisite 36 hours of OSLTCO Ombudsman Certification Training and be granted certification by the State LTC Ombudsman.
- After the hiring agency decides on a candidate for LTCOP Coordinator, work with the sponsoring agency to apply for Program Coordination designation by the State LTC Ombudsman.

- Attend the New Coordinator Training provided by the Office of the State Long-Term Care Ombudsman (OSLTCO).
- Attend biannual training conferences and other sponsored activities for LTCOP Coordinators as directed by the State LTC Ombudsman.

EDUCATION:

 Master's degree (preferred), or bachelor's degree with major course work in gerontology, social work, social planning, or related field.

SKILLS REQUIRED:

- Computer skills to maintain and report data, work with web-based systems, and use



Program Overview

The purpose of the Napa/Solano Area Agency on Aging PSA28 (N/S AAA) Dignity at Home Fall Prevention Program is to reduce falls and the fear of falling among older adults (60 and older) and adults with disabilities who are living in Napa and Solano Counties.

The program works in tandem with other N/S AAA Title IIID Health Promotion and Disease Prevention activities that target adults prone to falls.

Program Specifics

The N/S AAA contracts with service providers in Napa and Solano Counties to:

- 1. Educate community members about fall risks through community meetings and social media.
- 2. Operate under the "Stop Falls" umbrella of services of the N/S AAA.
- 3. Establish a screening process that prioritizes the most vulnerable including

Number of falls in the past six months

Number of falls resulting in 9-1-1 call

Number of falls resulting in hospitalization

Income level – if above income guidelines, refer to alternative resources

4. Provide in-home assessments, home modifications, and assistive devices to reduce falls and the risk of falling.

In-home assessments conducted by licensed Occupational or Physical Therapist

Assessments include:

Review of throw rugs, animals, items blocking walk ways Timed Up and Go for strength

"Assess Your Risk For Falls" questionnaire

· Home modifications installed by licensed contractors.

Modifications may include:

Grab bars, nonskid surfaces, handrails, and threshold modifications, poles, etc.

Assistive devices may include:

Gait belts, medication management items, night lights, toilet seat risers, shower seats, transfer benches, emergency alert devices, walking canes, etc.

5. Service providers will track and report service unit numbers, types, and costs; numbers of applicants who do not qualify because of income; waiting lists; services provided; referral sources; screening data; and additional resource referrals.

Senior Nutrition

- 1. Congregate Meals 37% of total Senior Nutrition Funding
- 2. Home Delivered Meals 63% of total Senior Nutrition Funding
- 3. Minimum annual funding allocation for all Senior Nutrition programs should not fall below \$337,907.
- 3. For 2020-2021, move \$20,000 from Senior Nutrition to IIIB Supportive Services





Discussion included, the Napa and Solano County Board of Supervisors August 2018 approved a Joint Exercise of Powers Agreement (JEPA) and the JEPA outlined the funding distribution formula based on population from the CDA

Intrastate Funding Formula dated December 2017 states Napa 26.51% and Solano 73.49%.

- On December 4, 2019 CDA released new 2020 California Department of Aging Population Demographic Projections by County and PSA for Intrastate Funding Formula. On April 16, 2020 the OB voted to amend the FY2020/21 funding allocation percentages to align with the CDA population recommended allocations of 26.17% for Napa County and 73.83% for Solano County.





Percentage (%) of Actual Expenditures to Annual Budget Administration and Contracted Direct Services





FIRST AMENDMENT TO THE JOINT EXERCISE OF POWERS AGREEMENT BETWEEN NAPA COUNTY AND SOLANO COUNTY (AREA AGENCY ON AGING)

THIS FIRST AMENDMENT ("First Amendment") is entered into as of _______, 2020, between the Napa County ("Napa") and Solano County ("Solano") individually referred to as "party," jointly referred to as "parties", each of which is a political subdivision of the State of California.

RECITALS

WHEREAS, the parties entered into that Joint Exercise of Powers Agreement dated (the "JEPA") to establish the Area Agency on Aging Serving Napa and Solano, the agency designated by the California Department on Aging ("CDA") within Planning and Service Area 28 ("PSA 28") pursuant to 22 C.C.R. § 7206 ("AAA"), and the joint operation of it; and

WHEREAS, the JEPA, in its Exhibit A, provides for a formula for distributing funds from CDA, grants and donations received from outside Napa or Solano between the two counties based on each county's percentage of the total population served by the AAA; and

WHEREAS, while the JEPA essentially requires the parties to set the percentages on an annual basis, this First Amendment would set the formula, subject to any future amendment by the parties; and

WHEREAS, the parties agree to amend the JEPA as set forth below.

AGREEMENT

1. Funding Distribution Formula (Exhibit A)

Exhibit A is deleted in its entirety and replaced with the Funding Distribution Formula attached to and incorporated into this First Amendment as Exhibit A-1.

2. Effectiveness of JEPA

Except as set forth in this First Amendment, all other terms and conditions specified in the JEPA remain in full force and effect.

EXHIBIT A-1

Funding Distribution Formula

- 1. Funds from CDA, grants and donations received from outside Napa or Solano shall be divided between the counties based on each county's percentage of the total population served by the AAA, as determined annually by CDA. For the first fiscal year (July 1 June 30) of the Agreement, the parties agree that the percentages shall be 26.51% for Napa and 73.49% for Solano.
- 2. As part of the annual budget approval process in Section 4 of the Joint Exercise Powers Agreement between Napa County and Solano County the parties shall consult and change, if necessary, the percentages for each subsequent fiscal year.
- 23. Donations received from within each county shall be credited to that county.
- 34. Audit Findings shall be shared as follows:
 - A. If the findings are related to a contract that provides services in only one county, the findings shall be the responsibility of the county where the services were provided.
 - B. For all other audit findings, the findings shall be shared based on each county's percentage of the total population served for the FY the finding is for.
