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Proposed Federal Cuts Threaten Lifeline Programs for Older and Disabled Adults

A resolution passed last week by both the U.S. House and Senate opens the door to deep and damaging cuts to Medicaid and the Supplemental Nutritional Assistance Program (SNAP)—programs relied upon every day by older adults, people with disabilities, caregivers and families in Napa and Solano counties.

If enacted into law, these cuts would strip at least \$880 billion from Medicaid and \$230 billion from SNAP—slashing critical health care and nutrition services to fund tax breaks for corporations and the wealthy.

This harmful policy is not yet law—but it could become one unless we speak out now. Richard White, Chair of the Napa/Solano Advisory Council on Aging, is calling on all community members to take action.
